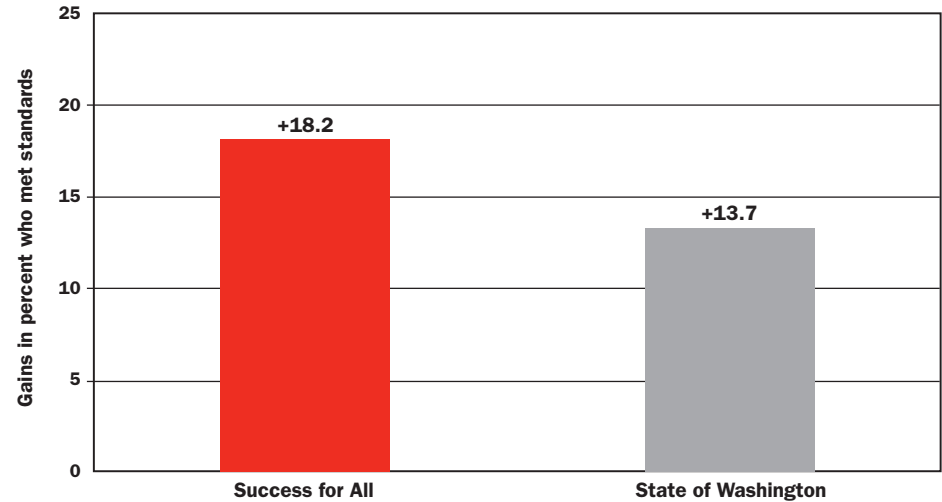
## Success for All Elementary Schools in Washington State Show a Decade of Growth on WASL – Reading

For the past ten years, Washington elementary schools using the Success for All reading program have made significant gains on the Washington Assessment of Student Learning (WASL) – Reading scale. **From 1999 to 2009, Washington Success for All schools had an 18.2 percentage-point increase in the number of students in grades 3–6 who met standards.** Overall, Washington elementary schools gained 13.7 percentage points.

Schools that made particularly outstanding gains for this period include:

- Taholah Elementary in Taholah: 37.6%
- Nespelem Elementary in Nespelem: 34.8%
- Roosevelt Elementary in Olympia: 32.3%
- Evergreen Elementary in Fort Lewis: 29.4%
- Jefferson Elementary in Mt. Vernon: 29.0%
- Hillside Elementary in Fort Lewis: 25.7%
- Little Mountain Elementary in Mt. Vernon: 24.9%
- Washington Elementary in Mt. Vernon: 24.5%
- Mark Twain Elementary in Federal Way: 23.2%
