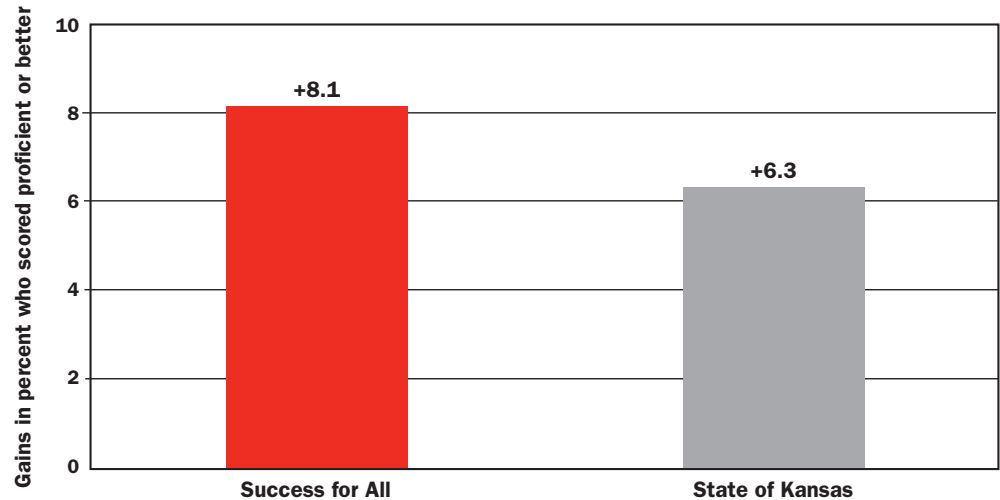
Success for All Schools in Kansas Gain on KSA – Reading

Kansas schools using the Success for All reading program once again made significant gains on the Kansas State Assessment (KSA) in reading. **From 2006 to 2008, Kansas Success for All schools had an 8.1 percentage-point increase in the number of students in grades 3–5 who scored proficient or better.** Other Kansas schools gained 6.3 percentage points.

Schools that made outstanding gains for this period include:

- Irving Elementary in Winfield: 33.8%
- Riley School in Great Bend: 19.9%
- Heller-North Lawn Elementary in Neodesha: 16.9%
- Elk Valley Elementary in Elk Valley: 16.0%
- Central Elementary in CUSD 462: 14.3%
- Washington Elementary in Geary County: 13.9%
- Atchison Elementary in Atchison: 13.0%
- Westside Elementary in USD 250: 12.5%
- St. Patrick Catholic: 12.1%
- Whittier Elementary in Winfield: 10.0%
- St. Paul School in USD 505: 9.4%
- Westwood Elementary in Geary County: 9.2%
