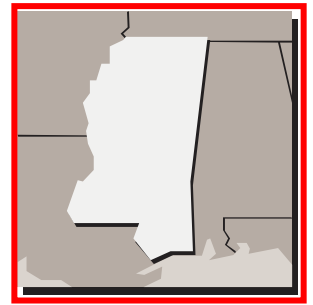


Success for Mississippi



Success for All Schools in Mississippi Gain on MCT-Reading

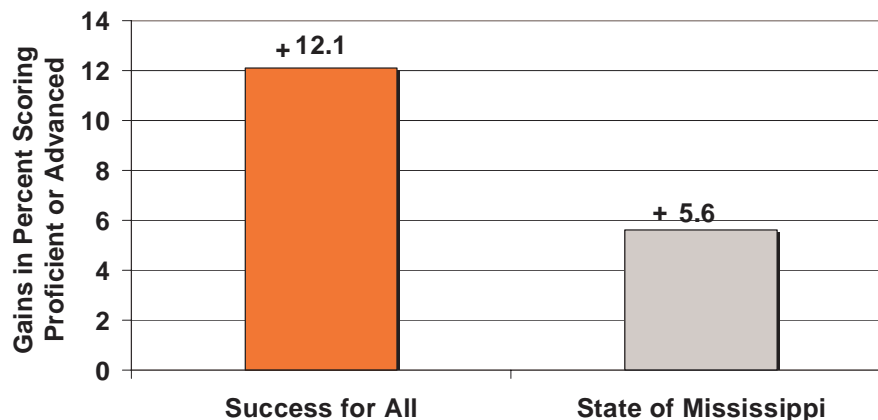
Mississippi schools implementing the Success for All reading program have once again made significant gains on the Mississippi Competency Test (MCT)-Reading scale. **From 2002 to 2005, Success for All schools increased by 12.1 percentage points the number of students in grades 2-5 scoring at proficient or advanced.** Other Mississippi schools gained 5.6 points.

Schools making particularly outstanding gains include:

- Gloster Elementary in Amite Co.: 39.0%
- Witherspoon Elementary in Meridian: 32.3%
- South Delta Elementary in South Delta: 30.8%
- T.J. Harris Elementary in Meridian: 20.4%
- South Side Elementary in West Point: 17.3%
- Parkview Elementary in Meridian: 16.0%
- Charlotte Hyatt Elementary in Moss Point: 15.2%
- O'Bannon Elementary in Western Line: 12.9%
- Kennedy Elementary in McComb: 12.2%
- Earl Nash Elementary in Noxubee Co.: 11.7%
- West Hills Elementary in Meridian: 11.2%
- Otken Elementary in McComb: 10.7%
- East Park Elementary in Moss Point: 10.7%
- Orange Lake Elementary in Moss Point: 10.2%
- Liberty Elementary in Amite Co.: 10.0%

The 2005 results repeat findings from Mississippi Success for All schools in previous years, and reflect findings in states throughout the U.S., affirming that students in Success for All schools gain more than other students on state accountability measures.
