Success for All Schools in New York State Gain on ELA

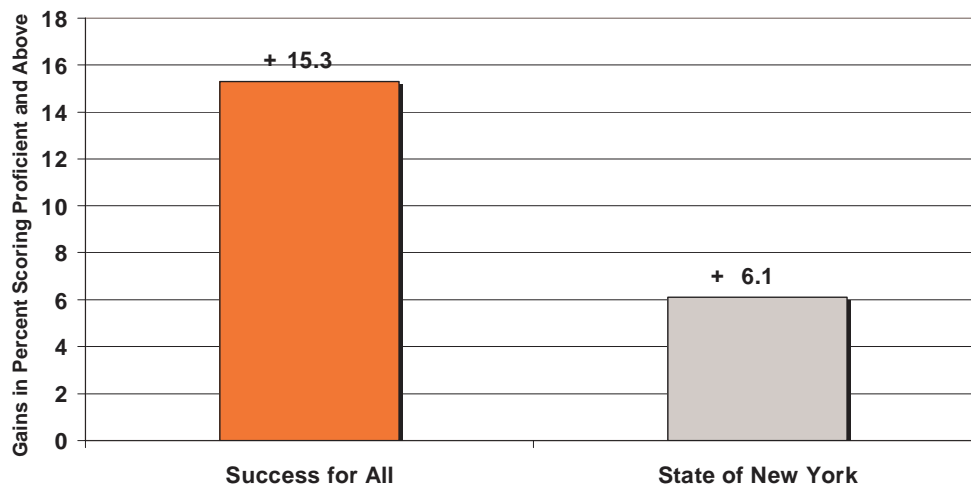
New York schools implementing the Success for All reading program once again made significant gains on the New York English Language Arts (ELA) test. **From 2003 to 2005, Success for All schools increased by 15.3 percentage points the number of fourth grade students scoring proficient or better (Levels 3 or 4).** Other New York schools gained 6.1 points.

Schools making particularly outstanding gains include:

- S.G. Love Elementary in Jamestown: 44.4%
- Friendship Central School in Friendship: 28.5%
- Giffen Elementary in Albany: 27.9%
- John M. Marshall Elementary in East Hampton: 25.1%
- PS 65Q in New York City: 22.9%

The 2005 results repeat findings from New York Success for All schools in previous years, and reflect findings in states throughout the U.S.: Success for All students typically gain more than other students on state accountability measures.
